

An anonymous letter sent to Sir Peter Henry Edlin.

The letter is undated but the envelope is post marked 16th September 1878 and again 17th September 1878. It was originally sent to the Sessions House but was re-directed to the home address of Sir Peter. It should be noted that the handwriting on the envelope is different to that on the letter.
