Edward Towsey, born in 1731, in Wantage, was the first child of Edward Towsey, the

younger and Sarah Geering.

Like his father and grandfather, Edward Towsey the first, this third Edward was also an apothecary.

He seems to have started out practicing at Lambourn: a town seven miles to the south west of Wantage.

In May, 1766, this Edward sold his entire business, including the drugs and utensils and moved back to Wantage to join his father's business. He is listed in 1768 as a freeholder of lands in Wantage and Letcombe Regis. In 1774 he married Martha Pinnock, the seventh of the eleven children of Robert and Dorothy Pinnock of Wantage

Edward Towsey died in February 1777. His wife died five weeks later, indicating that perhaps they died from an infectious disease.

Thus ended the line of apothecaries called Edward Towsey.
